

## BERLIN BORDER INCIDENT BLAMED ON BRITISH

East Berlin ADN in German to Germany 1412 GMT 11 March 1962--L

(Text) Two members of the British military liaison mission which is stationed in Potsdam were to blame for an incident Saturday night on the GDR state frontier with West Berlin. A car which could not be identified in the darkness had ignored signals to stop from the frontier guards. The occupants tried to escape a control by increasing their speed.

After several warning shots, shots were fired at the tires of the car which then stopped. It emerged that the two occupants, one of whom was wounded, were members of the British military mission. They were handed over to the command of the Soviet troops stationed in the GDR. The incident happened on the southern outskirts of West Berlin in the village of Klein-Machnow which belongs to the GDR .
