

## ACTIVITY OF SWISS-BASED ESCAPE ORGANIZATION EXPOSED

[Text] Prague Nov 30 CETEKA--In an article headlined "Smugglers of People" the youth daily MLADA FRONTA today deals with the activity of the Swiss joint-stock company Caropa, an organization for transferring people from socialist countries to the West.

The paper says that Czechoslovak Interior Ministry workers have uncovered in recent years the activity of several transfer organizations operating in Federal Germany, West Berlin, Austria and Switzerland. In February 1973 the authorities arrested Ernst Honegger, who was found guilty by a Czechoslovak court and sentenced to three years in prison. Now he is serving his sentence. The case of Honegger, an employee of the firm ARAMCO, helps throw the light on the dealings of ARAMCO, which is a cover-up name for the Caropa CC, Ltd., says MLADA FRONTA and continues:

The head of the organization is Hans Lenzlinger, resident in Zurich. He has a rich career behind him, and is now engaged in transferring people from socialist countries to the West, says the paper. For this he is using specially adjusted automobiles with caches and well-forged rubber stamps of passport control authorities and other Czechoslovak institutions.

"It is strange that Lenzlinger's organization need not conceal its activity from official Swiss police authorities, which have equipped his villa with night observation equipment and provided for him various technical gadgets such as fire-arm mufflers. People from Czechoslovakia in whom the Lenzlinger organization is interested have all their formalities, including asylum guarantees, arranged before their kidnaping," MLADA FRONTA says.

In conclusion the paper points out that "this unfair activity directed against Czechoslovakia would deserve, in the interest of good relations, a categorical intervention from Swiss authorities."
