Actually, it was built like a huge "Catamaran" sailing vessel, with two pontoons riding high out of the water. It had a mock-up bow to help camouflage it's true design. This did not make too much of an impression on me at the time, all though I did wonder about it's waird design. But now, as I reflect back upon it, I sudden ly realise that the ship in question would be ideal in servicing submarines at sea. He repeatedly looked back over his shoulder in the direction of the patrol boat to see if anyone was watching us while we were in the immediate area. (As it so happened, there was a sailor on the bridge of the patrol craft observing us at the time.) Soon after, Sr. Paula ushered me away from the area showing a pronounced nervousness as to our interloping on govt, property.
