

assistant producer, with Jay McMullen, CBS executive as producer. According to St. George, all the necessary "props," such as weapons, boats, motors, and other equipment, had been acquired. 2. St. George and his group were in direct touch with Rolando Masferrer Rojas and two of his assistants. St. George has had numerous contacts with Cuban emigre groups, including Representacion Cubana en el Exilio (RECE, Cuban Representation in Exile), the Asociacion Nacionalista Cubana (ANC, Cuban Nationalist Association), and the new Coordinacion de Fuerzas (Coordination of Forces). No Haitians were being consulted in connection with the film.
