- c. One of Masferrer's mea who went to the Deminican Republic corrying a small quantity of arms and amountation had been approhended by Deminican authorities despite the fact that the name had declared that the arms were for cale to the military. Santiago Ray Perma, Cuban amigra in the Deminican Republic, had been unable to intercede since he has lost his influence with the government of President Josquin Balaguer.
- d. Pather Georges will be the leader of the Haitian "incurrection."
- Nasferror said that in view of the arrest of his smissary in the Deminican Republic he was returning to New York for a few days until all was calm again. He added that the help of labort and certain other friends in the Deminican Republic was being given without the approval of the Balaguer government.
- 5. On 2 October 1966 Eugene L. Haminilien, Haitian Comoul General in Missi, caid that Father Georges' visit to Missi was to make a payment for war natorials and vessels purchased by Masferrer. Maniallien said that Father Georges had received \$2,000 from Paul Hagloire, former President of Haiti, about two weeks carlier and \$7,000 from Canada. Maximilien said he did not know who cent the meney from Canada.

- In late September Manual Olea, Cuban emigre, said that Masferrer had brought him from New York to take part in an operation against the Haitian regime. Olea said that in New York Masferrer had told him that he (Olea) usuld be chief of operations. Asserting to Olea, American newspapermen uses with them from the time they left New York until they arrived in Miami, taking metion plotures all the time. He remarked that since arriving in Miami he had found Masferrer's activities wery strange. He added that he thought nothing definite was going to take place, and that he had decided that he would not take part in the proceedings.
- 7. Olea caid that when he had acked Macferrer for came gume for precisice cheeving Macferrer had offered him some rifles but had teld him that he would have to buy his own bullets. He added that most of the gume Macferrer had were useless. Further, Olea caid, he had noticed that a man he knew only as Papito" was closely associated with Macferrer and also worked for the Haitian Consul in Miami. When "Papito" had learned that Macferrer was thinking of transferring his group to the Deminion Republic he had immediately obtained a Deminican visa.
- Olea complained that Masferror had given him only \$100 in Missi, and that he had spent about \$550 for room and board for himself and three others. He added that he had had an argument with Masferror because the plan was not a serious matter. Two of Olea's party had returned to New York and did not plan to come back to Missi.
