MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Security

SUBJECT : Admission to the U.S. for Two Aunts  
of Bernard L. Barker's Wife

1. Bernard L. Barker, a Cuban-American refugee in Miami (and former Captain in the USAF) has been actively cooperating with this agency since 1959 in Havana and Miami. He has shown his loyalty to the U.S. Government and his work for this agency has been very satisfactory.

2. It has now been learned that two aunts of subject's wife arrived in Mexico from Cuba on 22 September 1965. On 28 September 1965 they applied for visas to the U.S. Applicants are: Margarita LAMAR Laine; DPOB 20 May 1907, Havana, Cuba; PP 51527 (confined to a wheelchair since 1933) and her sister Maria Luisa LAMAR Laine; DPOB 21 July 1900, Havana, Cuba; PP 44495.

3. Headquarters and Miami Station traces on applicants are negative as are Miami FBI traces.

4. It is requested that Alien Affairs Staff arrange with Immigration and Naturalization Service for the expediting of these applicants into the U.S.
