 Citizenship Status of ANGLATTE-1

1. Pursuant to the discussions held in the summer and fall of 1961 between Major F. W. BAKER and JAMES HUGHES representatives, concerning the possible avenues of action by which ANGLATTE-1 might regain his citizenship, WFO has made inquiries to determine the feasibility of re-introducing a private bill in Congress, based on ANGLATTE-1's past services to certain U.S. organizations.

2. WFOY has advised that ANGLATTE-1 furnished those information "of minor importance"; the Bureau of Customs and the Narcotics Bureau had no record of ANGLATTE-1. WFOY, after repeated inquiries, has informed us that they cannot locate ANGLATTE-1's file.

3. It would seem that a new private bill would have as little hope of success as the two previously introduced, since a strong case cannot be made for L-1's prior services, based on the weak or negative results noted above, and it is currently possible to request a legal re-examination of the basis for WFO's action to strip L-1 of citizenship, since the file is missing.

4. It is recommended, therefore, that the best method whereby ANGLATTE-1 can regain his citizenship is to apply at the nearest consulate overseas for an immigrant visa. Mexico City is the most likely place. If WFOY and ANGLATTE-1 agree to do this, Headquarters will be glad to assist in expediting the visa issuance.

The possible course of action by which citizenship, AMELATTER-1 has made inquiries to determine the feasibility of re-initiating a private bill in Congress, based on AMELATTER-1's past services to anti-Communist organizations.

2. IWHI has advised that AMELATTER-1 furnished them information of minor importance; the Bureau of Customs and the Narcotics Bureau had no record of AMELATTER-1. IWHI, after repeated inquiries, has informed us that they cannot locate AMELATTER-1's file.

3. It would seem that a new private bill would have to be introduced during the two previously introduced bills. It would be necessary to make use of L-1's prior services, based on the work of AMELATTER-1. It is not clear, but it is certainly possible to request a legal re-examination of the basis for L-1's action to strip L-1 of citizenship, since the file is missing.

4. It is recommended, therefore, that AMELATTER-1 can regain his citizenship is to apply at the Mexican Consulate in Mexico City for an immigrant visa. Mexico City is the most likely place of entry, and IWHI agree to do this. Headquarters will be glad to assist in expediting the visa issuance.
