At the invitation, Mr. KUHNKE, SB/2, and the writer participated in a conference with Mr. [03] Mexico Desk, WH/3, on this date. Mr. [03] is interested in placing Subject in the Washington, D. C. area and is currently contemplating an assignment with the Office of Training. Mr. KUHNKE had previously given an advisory opinion to Joseph KING, SO/OTM, concerning the utilization of Subject in a Staff capacity at [01]. It was understood that OTR advised WH Division that Subject could not be assigned to [01] for security and cover reasons.

During the course of an informal discussion with the writer and Mr. KUHNKE, the position of WH Division, according to Mr. [03] was to explore all avenues of approach whereby a suitable assignment for Subject might be obtained. Mr. [03] recognizes that the possibility of having Subject converted to a Staff Employee is not good. Factors to be considered in this regard include Subject's alien wife

Mr. [03] indicated that it would be desirable not to jeopardize Subject's covert status in order to preserve his potential as a Career Agent.

WH Division appears to be committed to bring the Subject to the Washington, D. C. area beginning about March 1960. During the course of Subject's tour in the area,

The tour would also enable Subject's wife to fulfill the residency requirements for naturalization. Mr. [03] does not preclude the possibility of a request from WH Division to make Subject a Staff Employee should this be essential to accomplish his aim. He recognizes that such a request would entail exceptions or waivers under current procedures. It was suggested to Mr. [03] by Mr. KUHNKE that the most likely feasible use for Subject under prevailing regulations was to secure for him a training assignment at a covert location where Staff standards would not apply.
