Haitian Delegation to the UN, was a CP member in Haiti.

T-18 advised on April 21, 1951 and July 17, 1951 that telephone calls had been placed from the subject's residence to one JESSIE TRIECHLER at Yellow Springs, Ohio, telephone number 1501J1.

The 1949-1950 issue of the "Bulletin" of Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio, identified JESSIE ANDERSON TRIECHLER as having been the Assistant to the President of Antioch College since 1943 and a staff member of the college since 1944. She was also a graduate of Montana State Normal College and the State University of Montana, and a former employee of the State University of Montana and the Yale Department of Drama.

T-3 advised that JESSIE TRIECHLER signed a Communist Party Nominating Petition in the State of Ohio in 1940.

T-19, a former faculty member at Antioch College, and a former member of the CP, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in 1951 that he considered JESSIE TRIECHLER, through his association with her over the years, to be a "fellow traveler" to the CP.

T-16 advised on September 7, 1951 that the subject had communicated with a person known as G. SCOTT, Route 1, Box 158, Heiberger, Alabama.

Mr. ANDREW MOORE, letter carrier and Postmaster at Heiberger, Alabama, advised that CORSETTA SCOTT, who resides at the above address, now attends the New England Conservatory of Music. He advised that she had in the past sung on the same program with PAUL ROBESON at ROBESON'S personal invitation.

It is noted that LOUIS F. EUDENZ, a self-admitted former member of the CP who is also a former editor of the "Daily Worker", stated that prior to his defection in 1945, he knew PAUL ROBESON as a secret CP member.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist daily newspaper.
