SUBJECT: Barold CIRIXCIL

- 1. This igency is in receipt of information dated 7 July senserving one Harold CITRINGLI, born March 10, 1923, New York, New York, New York, U.S. passport number 743701, including wife Beulah, daughter Marilya, issued Jammry 20, 1958, sashington, D.C. Subject sarrived in Copenhagen with his family June 29 from Moscow claiming involuntary detention in the USA from October 25, 1958. Subject entered the USA via Esschoalovakia on February 27, 1958 as a tourist but with the intention of establishing residence and adopting Soviet citizenship. Subject claimed he was given employment as a Design Engineer in a Charkov factory which manufactured sine safety equipment, but by the fall of 1958 he had become disillusioned with the Soviet system and began efforts to return to the United States.
- 2. In an interview with an efficier of the U.S. Ambassy in Copenhagen, Subject intimated that it; USER has attempted and may continue to attempt to use his family or their activities to the detriment of the United States. His wife claimed to be strongly anti-Soviet and stated that she accompanied her husband only to preserve the family unity. Since subject was highly nervous and concerned only with his immediate return to the United States, it was impossible to obtain a complete or coherent story. Subject privately arranged for his passage to the United States. He and his family were due to arrive in sew lork via LAS flight SK 911, July 3, 6:55 A.M. His probable destination in the United States was given ast Hrs. Swa CITRYNALL, (mother), 2741 Walace Avenue, Bronk, New York; or Abraham MARCUS (wife's father), 304 E. Flace, Bronk.
- 3. The address of 2741 Valace Avenue bears a telephone listing under the name of Jacob CITRINGL, Kingsbridge 7-1517. The address 304 E Place is probably 334 Echo Place which bears a telephone listing under the name of A. MRCUS, Cipress 4-1231.
- A. The records of this office reflect that one Abraham MARKUE, born 22 February 1887 in Serejas, Lithmania, spried for a U.J. visa at the American Embassy in rexico City during the routh of
