SUBJECT: Cuidance to Seratino EGMAULDI for his Meeting with Eusebio MUJAL on 26 June to Discuss MUJAL's List of CTC Leaders (copy attached) and Answer MUJAL's Request for Comments as to Which of Them Might be Acceptable to PED.

On 23 June Mr reference to MUJAL's talk or a labor front in connection with the FRD, Mr. Reichhardt said we had no knowledge of any plan for a labor front as such. Mr. Reichhardt referred to the agreement between ICO and WE/4 that there would be no official contact with MUJAL and ROMAULDI's contact would be continued only for the purpose of monitoring, and that to the extent possible CIA assets would be used to negate MUJAL's activities. He also mentioned that Tony VARONA had said he would talk to MIJAL from time to time in order to be informed of what MIJAL was doing, but he had no idea of including MUJAL, or any of his group, in the FRO complex. Mr. Reichbardt said he felt it must be assumed that MUJAL is aware of RCMAULDI's conmeetion with the U.S. Government and would, therefore, interpret RCMAULDI's reply as official approval or disapproval. In view of the above, Mr. Reichhardt recommended that RCMAUIDI's response to MIJAL should be that the choice of labor leaders to be affiliated with the FRD is an FRD matter and would have to be decided by FRD leaders, but it was RCMAULDI's personal opinion that none of the CTC leaders listed by MUJAL would be acceptable to the FRD because of their affiliation with the BATISTA regime. He suggested that if MUAL pressed ROWAULDI for an answer, he might tell and he should take the matter up with VARCVA.

greed with the above in principle and thought REGAUANE reply to MUJAL should be along those lines. However, he brought up the matter of VARCHA's sclection of Refael OTERO, who is closely allied with MUJAL, to make a speaking tour of latin America; and mentioned that YARCHA had previously indicated an interest in Manolo FERMANDEZ of the Artists Union. Both OTERO and FERMANDEZ are included on MUJAL's list. Mr. Reichhardt said he did not know VARCHA's reason for selecting ottens for this tour, but since it was not to begin until 1 July, Mr. Droller would have time to discuss the matter again with VARCHA and take some action if it was decided that OTERO is ton closely allied with MUJAL to be effective with Latin American countries, but he is not an effective speaker and is a known MUJALISTA.
