REVARKS:

The man who is popularly known as "Tony" was one of the organizers of the famous University Students' Directorate in 1929. Always persistent in the struggle against Machado, Varona was imprisoned on numerous occasions. After the fall of Machado he collaborated with Grau, Prio and others in organizing the Autentico Party. In 1935 he became Chief of Organization for the Autenticos, and wields tremendous power in the Canaguey Autentico political machine, known as the TOGA, which has been reported involved in kidnapping, graft, and related practices.

Varona was a strong supporter of President Grau during the latter's administration and was considered one of Prio's closest friends.

Imbued with the same revolutionary spirit as his anti-Machado colleagues, Varona, as early as 1921 had formed the Asociacion de Estudiantes del Instituto de Canaguey and in 1930 he was a member of the Directorio Astudiantil Universitario. In the summer of 1947 Varona actively participated in the abortive attempt against the Dominican Republic.

Although Varona does not have a good regutation, he is clever, and upon assuming the post of Frime Linister, it was expected that he would nelp restore parliamentary government in Cuba.

Rezarks:

On the question of Cuban economy, Varona favors a diversification in Cuban industry. He stated that it would seen advantageous to the United States to keep at present minimum levels the threat of Communist influence in the Western Hemisphere by such measures as a more liberal, assured quota for Suban sugar in the United States.

Varona's former wife is the private secretary to President Frio. It is reported that he is somewhat handicapped by his present wife, Melina Amisanchez who is of questionable background. 1

In September 1947, he was one of the senators arging the rotion, which was later passed, to vote for the diplomatic isolation of the Franco Sovernment and for the recognition of the Espublican Government in Srile. 2/

During the eight mays in August 1950 that Varona was acting Linister of Labor be accomplished several startling and important acts. He signed decrees authorizing the intervention of the Communist news organs Hoy and America Deportival

He stated publicly that the Government contemplated action which would remove all Communists from labor organizations.

Soon after he was nexed Linister of the Interior in September 1950, it was runored that de Varona would stay on permanently as Minister of the Interior and be replaced as Frine Kinister. On the other hand there was speculation that de Varona would replace Liguel Suarez Fernandez as Fresident of the Senate, possibly leaving the Cabinet to do so. 3/ This speculation became a reality when de Varona left the office of Frize Kinister to accept the Fresidency of the Cuban Senate on 6 October 1950. 4/
