IDENTIFYING DATA

Subject of this report is Evelio Duque MIYAR, born in December 1926 in Trinidad, Cuba. Subject was technically interrogated on 10 April 1962 at a covert site in South Miani, Florida. The interrogetion was conducted in Spanish through [Hr. Flederick Henderson] who acted as interpreter and included such topics as Communism, Parsonal History, vulnerability to blackmail, and association with intelligence organizations. At the request of the Case Officer, Subject was also asked specific questions about using "war names" in Cube.

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CONCLUSION

Test charts do not indicate any deception to questions pertaining to the above topics.

DETAILS

On 21 December 1961 Subject was initially polygraphed at which time the polygraph Examiner stated that Subject was concealing information in the following areas:

. Past attempts to blackmail Subject.

2. Personal History Statements. 3. Former Communist sympathies.

4. Association with political organizations other than those already known to us.

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5. Arrost by police officials.

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As a consequence of the technical findings, the polygraph Examiner recommended that Subject not be polygraphed again until

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such time as he had been debuisted in detail regarding all activiti associated with the above topics. Therefore, prior to Subject's recent polygraph test, he was thoroughly debriefed by Frederick 06 Henderson, a member of the CI/Staff at the WAVE station. It is of interest to note [Mr. Henderson's) impressions of Subject which explained rather clearly the make up of the man and why he had so much difficulty during his first polygraph test. Thr. Henderson declared that Subject's verbal expression is poor and also that he has an extremely difficult time writing. Subject Lacks the ability to concentrate for any length of time on one subject and also has trouble in conceiving actual time and space factors. In addition, Subject had a difficult time understanding the questions on the PRQ. Further more Subject did not understand the principle of the polygraph iustrument during the first test. Wht. Henderson stated that the Subjec had no idea that the instrument measured physiological changes to questions which Subject associated with his background.

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During the debriefing, Subject denied that there had been any past attempts to blackmail him, that he lied about his personal histor statements, that he was formerly sympathetic to Communiss, or that he had associated with political organizations other than those already known to us. However, on the topic of errests, Subject declared that he was arrested twice under the Batista Regime and detained once under the Castro Regime. Subject declared that his first errest occurred toward the end of 1952. Subject stated that at that time he was site ting in a barber shop in Havana when a plain-clothes man heard him discussing the regime in uncomplimentary terms. Subject declared that he was arrested, taken to the second police station in Havana, and kept overnight, questioned in the morning and released. Subject stated that his second arrest was on the 11th of June 1956 when hhe went to Havana from the mountains of Escambray with a message. Having gotten off at the Camibus Station, it turned out that all persons arriving at the station were picked up, arrested and interrogeted. He stated that he was able to explain his way out of the arrest and was identified and therefore was released. "Subject related that he was detained by Castro's militis at the time he was trying to escape from Cubs, however, it turned out that the militie was looking for another Cuban and consequently, Subject was released. During polygraph testing, Subject was asked the following specific questions:

Political organization? Answer: No.

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2. Have you ever been a member of the Cuban Communist Party? Answer: No.

3. Do you have a secret means of communication with any Communist Intelligence Service? Answer: No.

4. Are you presently receiving any money from any Communist Intelligence Organization? Answer: No.

5. Have you been assigned a secret code name by any Castro Intelligence Service? Answer: No.

6. Have you intentionally falsified any of the Personal History Statements that you have given us! Answer: No.

Are you now baing blackmailed? Answer:

8. Nore you arrested more than twice by the Batista Regime! Inewer: No.

9. Were you detained more than once by the Cuban Régime? Answer: No. 10. Did you tell up the truth about your cacepe from Cuba?

Answert Yes.

11. Have you over used the war name Mandlico? Answer: No

12. Have you ever used the war name Frank? Answert No.

13. Have you ever used the war name Flaviot Answer: No.

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
