

FACTORS INVOLVED

1. AKLADAL detected of his own volition to [redacted] Kislinski, knowing he was a representative of U. S. Intelligence.
2. He requested asylum in the United States and did so in writing. In so doing and as a result of his detection, he realized that he needed protection, which he was granted.
3. He has been proved beyond reasonable doubt to be a genuine defector and has provided substantial quantities of valuable intelligence information, principally of a CI nature.
4. He is in the United States pending to CIA, he has not yet been legally admitted for residence.
5. He apparently is convinced that both he and the information he has is of most essential value to the West, has insisted on discussing this with the highest levels of the U. S. Government, and has insisted on a very large sum of money and virtual carte blanche to use it for propaganda and political action operations directed against the USSR.
6. He has reacted with indignation to the suggestion that he be put on a salary of approximately \$400.00 per month

and his case officer believes he would react similarly to an offer of a payment of \$10,000, with additional sums and benefits dependent upon his further cooperation.

7. He has suggested that if his demands are not met, he be made available to some other government which would appreciate him properly and recognize his value, apparently, by accepting the same kind of demands he has made of the United States Government.
