upon his return in 1950 to Japan. YOSHINO submitted information concerning the local Russians, the new Soviet mitizens and the Russian Jewish businessmen in Japan. YOSHINO has three sub-sources:

(1) OKA (code neme) painter at Johnson Air Porce Base

(2) TOKADA (code neme), draftsman at Tachikawa Air Force Base,

(3) MARUYAMA, employee of Customs office in the port of Kobe.

In payment YOSHINO receives 30,000 Yen for month from the Sov Mis, of which he gives 5,000 Yen to OKA and 5,000 Yen to TOKADA. His contributions were not considered of great value and besides the Sovs, according to Source, were always suspicious of YOSHINO. It was known that he was also an agent for the Jatanese Police. YOSHINO works for the Shinten Enterprise Co., and it was Source's chinion that YOSHINO as instructed by both Japanese and American Intelligence to gather military information concerning Sakhalin when he made a tripto sakhalin for the company (in 1902). YOSHINO had been with the Soviet Press, but was dismissed from this position after a disagreement with AURAHASHI, head of the Soviet Press. Despite these suspicions, YOSHINO as retained upon instructions from the Center when reports were received that YOSHINO was strongly anti-American.

.... para 8: Emergency Plens: SOURCE stated that the only MVD emergency intelligence coverage as emcodied in the ECONOMIS and TATEKATSU stay-behind nets. YISHIND's wife's brother (written in notation reads TAKA), probably a member of the JCP, had allegedly been recruited by YOSHIND at the cost of 50,000 Yen, but source cannot assert the validity of this operation. The courier is a bookkeeper, code name "TAKA", and worked on the Kisen MFRU, which at one time went to India, but he is now perhaps on another ship plying between U.S. and Japan. "TAKA has hever been activated and remains a paper asset only.
