On the meeting took place at Congress Hall 10-12 from 1000 to 1100  
at the New York Hotel, 11 West 23rd Street, by York Plaza. The

8. Chittas was all business and gave first a long exposition of his views on how Castro could be overthrown. The end of his speech is as follows:

Thus, one should look for people who are both young and either have or are able to inspire popular discontent.

3. Speaking more specifically about resistance activities inside Cuba, Cliffee talked about the activities of Manuel Bay, whose representative he, Cliffee, is. Manuel Bay is currently engaged in reestablishing the Resistencia Civica -- an organization Bay headed in the anti-Dictatorship days. Bay also tries to organize and bring into the Resistencia Civica members and elements of the 26th-of-July movement and of the Revolutionary Army. (In this connection, Cliffee confirmed his talks with Major Victor Pascual, aka Comandante Diego, who is a member of the Alianza.)

4. Concerning activities outside Cuba, Cliffee talked very laudatory about and recommended the greatest part the utilizing of the Batista crowd, with whom he seems to be in touch.

5. Cliffee is also in touch with Barcia and Kiro Carboon, as well as Felix Pascual.

6. Prior to today's parting, Cliffee said that he had talked to Carrillo and received a somewhat chilly reception; that he himself did not care whether or not he "leads the FED," as one label is as good as another; that he was only interested in one thing -- organized resistance to Batista. He conceded that such an organization needed outside help, and he further conceded that it might be a good idea to utilize one single label, such as FED, for all anti-Castro activities, inside or outside the country. He stated that he himself is, by character and inclination, inclined for public appearances, lobbying activities, and similar propagandistic operations. His forte, he said, is in the clandestine organization of a revolutionary activity.

7. Cliffee said that he is completely "in" the command of Manuel Bay and that if he were to be fired from the Cuban Navy, he will go over and return to the United States, he would probably join the Bay.

In addition, Cliffee "knows" about his own financial situation, but has no intentions. Soviet Russia aid in this regard if it is needed.

9. It was agreed that Chibas would get in touch with Ray; would ascertain the current status of Ray's internal organization and Ray's desire regarding affiliation and/or integration with the PRA. Bender and Chibas would get together sometime during the week of 12 September to discuss mutual cooperation further.
