Headquarters Comments

The following report is one of a series containing personality information provided by the source and includes supplemental information from the records of this Agency.

It is requested that the addressees take no action on any of the individuals mentioned in the personality reports without first checking with this Agency.

- 1. Tomas TOIRAC Ortiz is a sergeant in the Cuban police who, as of April 1964, was assigned to the Direction General de Inteligencia (General Directorate of Intelligenco - DGI). In the evenings and on his days off he works as a bus inspector.
- 2. TOIRAC was born sometime before 1926. He is five feet seven inches tall, weighs 150 pounds, and has a heavy build. He has a fair complexion and gray hair. TOIRAC wears glasses for reading 1,2,3

Headquarters Comments

- A fairly reliable source, in a document dated 5 August 1959, stated that one Sergeant Tomas TOIRAC Ortiz was an agent in the Gambling Bureau of the Departamento Tecnico de Investigaciones de la Policia Nacional Revolucionaria (DTIPNR).
- 2. In a report dated 3 August 1962, Tomás TOIRAC Ortiz' brother reported the following information on TOIRAC:

"Tomas TOIRAC Ortiz is my brother. He is a sergeant in the DTI in the main office at Monserrate and Émpedrado $\frac{1}{1}$

Habana. He has the title, he told me, of Jefe del Guarnicion, but I do not know of what compound he is the chief. He lives on Avenida 43, between Calle 120 and 122, on the south side of the street, exactly in the middle of the block. He is living with, but not married to, Luz Maria LNU. They have two boys, names unknown. He was formerly married to and divorced from Lidya VILLORIO. They have three sons: Jorge, Carlos, and a third whose name I forgot. They are all members of the Policia Nacional. My brother and his former wife also had two girls. He is now seeing his former wife again and living part of the time with her and part of the time with Luz Maria. I do not know if he is actually a member of any political party, but he is an avid supporter of the Castro government. On my last visit to see him prior to leaving Cuba, he told me that I should not go, that living conditions in Cuba are far better than in the United States, and that the future of Cuba is bright. He was born in 1910, is five feet four inches tall, when the light complexion."

3. In a report dated 20 September 1962, an untested source reported information on the DTI of the Departamento de Order Publico (DOP). In this report he stated that one Sergeant Tomas TOIRAC Ortiz, a self-declared Communist, was attached to the Carpeta (Receiving Section).
