Headquarters Comments

The following report is one of a series containing personality information provided by the source and includes supplemental information from the records of this Agency.

It is requested that the addressees take no action on any of the individuals mentioned in the personality reports without first checking with this Agency.

Juan GUIDO Licea is known as a courier and often visits the "M" Building of the Direccion General de Inteligencia (General Directorate of Intelligence - DGI) to pick up and deliver material. According to source, GUIDO is not a member of the DGI. 1,2,3,4,5

Headquarters Comments

1. An untested source, in a report dated 1 March 1961, stated that one Juan Guido LICEA Figueredo was a private in the Intelligence Department, G-2, of the Cuban Ministry of the Armed Forces (MINFAR).
2. As an attachment to a report dated 8 February 1962, was a list of members of Cuban G-2. Included on this list was one Juan G. LICEA Figueredo who was identified as a soldier in the Rebel Army; G-2.
3. In July 1962 an untested source reported that Guido LICEA was a Communist and a G-2 sergeant in Habana and assigned to the G-2 offices at 5th and 14th Streets. He was born about 1932.

is five feet ten inches tall, 180 pounds, and has a dark complexion. Prior to 1959 he was a carpenter's helper. He has a brother, Walter, stationed with the Rebel Army in Pinar del Rio.

4. The records of this Agency reveal the following travel of Juan Guido LICEA ~~Figueredo~~, identified as a Cuban diplomatic courier, taken from [redacted] travel manifests. His date of birth was given as 14 February 1929 in Habana.

5. In a report dated 16 July 1964, it was stated that Juan GUIDO Licea, a Cuban diplomatic courier, had applied for a Canadian non-immigrant visa in order to visit the Cuban Embassy in Ottawa for a period of one week. The following information on GUIDO was taken from the visa application:

GUIDO was born on 14 February 1929 in Habana, Cuba, and is a Cuban citizen. He is a diplomatic courier for the Ministry of Foreign Relations and his purpose of entry into Canada was listed as diplomatic courier. He holds Cuban diplomatic passport E/64/250 issued on 10 April 1964 at Habana. His permanent address is Calzada y G, Vedado, Habana, Cuba.
