The available evidence on file in reference cables, particularly in view of the conduct of [redacted] here in Belgrade in its relations with [redacted], leads [redacted] to agree with the views expressed in reference cables. It would be of value if this station could be advised of any other [redacted] efforts of this kind that come to our attention. It might be that [redacted] possibilities would be presented by them.

2. There has come to our notice Helsinki Dispatch #266, dated October 21, 1952, reporting an attempt by [redacted], First Secretary of the Yugoslav Legation in Helsinki, to secure information concerning American views on the [redacted] of the Communist Party. The tactics used remind us of [redacted]; also, the subject of [redacted]'s interest ties the matter in with [redacted]. Just in case you have not seen the dispatch we are enclosing a copy for you. (We wonder whether the real intent of [redacted] was not to feed the American source material back to us in Belgrade!) The expression "loyalty with a club" might well be used in describing certain of our exchanges here in Belgrade!
