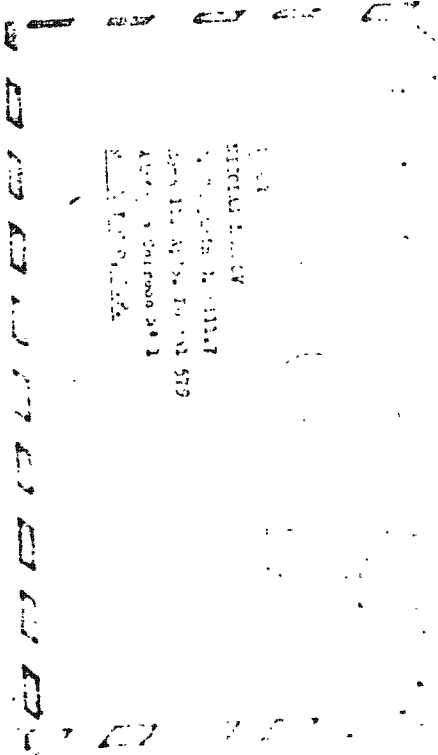

<p>1. Attached for your information is a copy of a letter obtained through LIALI, which Subject directs to <u>Soviet Press Attache in Mexico City Nikolay Sergeyevich LEONOV (201-132139)</u>. From the letter it appears that Subject knows LEONOV and his family personally.</p> <p>2. Subject also sends greetings to "Alejandro." This may refer to Aleksandr Mikhaylovich BROVKIN (201-135114), Third Secretary in Mexico City who has worked with LEONOV. LEONOV is an identified KGB officer, and BROVKIN is suspect KGB.</p> <p>3. Mexico City Station traces show that Carlos BONILLA Sanchez, who is perhaps identical with Subject, travelled to Mexico on 26 November 1964. He is described as a Communist leader from Colombia. [ ] 5109, December 1964). Both LEONOV and BROVKIN were in Mexico in November 1964. It would be appreciated if Station [ ] could confirm the identity of Subject.</p>
