I, Luis Antonio Spay Pina gave the
24th of December 1960, at the U.S. Embassy
in Havana, Cuba, to Mr. [redacted]

[redacted] an envelope with the following
contents: A photostatic copy of the
Revolutionary Unity original document,
a leaf of paper of 8" by 11" with some
addresses, a half leaf of paper of about
6" by 4 1/2" cut in half, and 4, \$100.
dollar bills - This envelope was
addressed to Fred Landis, at Miami.

I never got in touch with [redacted]
because when I got to call him
at Miami, we was called back to
Cuba on account of the relation rupturing
between the U.S. and Cuba. - Rafael Spay

told me that he got the envelope he
sent, but he didn't mine. He asked

[redacted] wife and she didn't know
a thing about it. -
