1. Subject arrived in [redacted] on [redacted] and requested an interview with [redacted] on [redacted]. [redacted] was born on [redacted] in [redacted], [redacted]. His parents and grandparents were [redacted] citizens and so is Subject. He is a member of the Executive group of [redacted] [redacted] [redacted]. He was arrested on [redacted] and [redacted] [redacted]. He spent all this time in the [redacted] [redacted] with the following US officials: John H. Bradley and [redacted], both professors of Villanova University; [redacted] Gibson, director of the [redacted] [redacted]; Harry [redacted], [redacted], and another unidentified US national. The above mentioned individuals were still in [redacted] when Subject left.

2. Subject stated that one George Alonzo [redacted], a radio operator who entered clandestinely into Cuba from the US to assist the underground, [redacted] [redacted] to the G-2. Alonzo informed Subject of [redacted] [redacted] operations; [redacted] operation was aimed [redacted] and the other [redacted].

3. Subject stated that he is next [redacted] to [redacted] [redacted] with representatives of US agencies in order to render a full report of the conditions of some of the underground groups in Cuba. Subject is fluent in English and French and is particularly conversant with the [redacted] [redacted] [redacted] [redacted] in Havana. He also wants to contact [redacted] which is his code name of a [redacted] agent for the underground in the US.

4. Subject was extremely nervous and excited and requested that he be allowed to rest for a few days before contact is established.
