MEMORANDIAN FOR THE INCORD

SUBJECT: Plans for the Establishment of a Provisional Government

REF: Paragraph 3, 20 Murch 1961 Memo for the Record, Subject as Above

- 1. On 20 Kirch 1961 at 1730 hours Mr. telephonically advised Mr. Rapoli that Miro Cardona had been unanimously elected Provisional President. The MIP, with Ray in attendance, voted in the election.
- 2. At 2315 hours 20 March Mr. Roel informed the undersigned telephonically from Miumi that Miro Cardona and some numbers of the Assembly would proceed to New York and that Mr. Carr would also fly to New York in order to be on hand. The undersigned informed Mr. along the lines of Bell 3004 (077 7728) attached.
- 3. On 21 March Nr. Napoli was dispatched to New York after he had been briefed along the lines of Bell 3004 in order to assist Nr. Carr is every possible way. By 1600 hours we had been informed that the following 19 Cubans, including Miro Cardona, were proceeding to New York: Miro, Passe, Rey, Chibas, Artime, Varena, Carrillo, Alvarez Diuz, Vargas Gozaz, Carbo, Fernandez Traviesa, Ollada, Orlando Hodriguez, Hevin, Miguel Gonzales interpreter who is coming at the request of Miro-Barquin, Beruff. Bernie Barker is going along as general handy man.
- b. In Nov York, we matters now stand, the Cubans will first meet in private in order to finalise their joint declaration and their program. The entire Assembly will then call a press conference at which time they will announce their unity in electing Eiro Cardona as the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council and in having agreed on a program. After this Eiro will make his acceptance speech. In this connection it should be noted that it is hoped to have the publicity and handled by both Beichman, a mamber of the "Christian Science Monitor" staff and an acquaintance of Schlesinger, and Lon Jones.
- 5. At noon of March 21 the undersigned was in telephonic contect with Mr. Bradock of the State Department and the undersigned asied Mr. Bradock whether or not the Department of State was in agreement to the release-by the Cubans-of their platform, a resume of which had been made evailable to the Department of State (Mr. Berle) on 7 March. Mr. Bradock edvised the undersigned at 1500 hours that the Department was in full agreement with the platform and had no objections to its release.

6. In the noon hours of 21 Narch the first press story (UPI) on the sreation of the Revolutionary Council appeared on the virse (a copy is attached).
