ANTI-FIDEL CASTRO ACTIVITIES  
INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA

On February 21, 1963, a confidential informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he had learned that [redacted] to the United States, had contacted [redacted] for the purpose of advising him that Jose Hiro Cardona, President of the Cuban Revolutionary Council, an organization opposed to Fidel Castro, Cuban Prime Minister, had apologized for not keeping an appointment he had been granted with [redacted]. Cardona stated that he had been extremely impressed with what [redacted] had done for Cuba and told [redacted] that those individuals who had said that [redacted] had to be removed had already been expelled from Cardona's group. [redacted] commented that the meeting Cardona had missed was a meeting of all important Cuban leaders who went to Guatemala to sign an agreement. [redacted] indicated that Cardona wished to see [redacted] in order to relieve any misunderstanding and [redacted] agreed to see Cardona anytime he would come to Guatemala. He instructed [redacted] to issue Cardona a visa at his request.

The position of [redacted] was verified through the "Diplomatic List" dated November, 1962, published by the United States Department of State.
