Action Required: As stated in paragraph 3.

1. As reported in Reference A, paragraph 1, the medical/vocational rehabilitation program has reduced the number of individuals receiving monthly medical dependency payments to six "hard core" cases. One of this number, a serious medical case who resides locally, [redacted] is funded by Garcia Lines. The background of the cases and previous correspondence with Headquarters regarding resolution of the problem is contained in References B through I. Being forwarded Under Separate Cover are Attachments A, B and F, the case histories for [redacted] and [redacted] of special interest is Reference C and [redacted] forwarded case histories on [redacted] and [redacted] for analysis and comment by the Medical Staff. Medical reports originated subsequent to the submission of the Reference C report and are being forwarded Under Separate Cover as Attachments C, D and E.

2. The current status of each of the remaining cases is summarized as follows:

- a. [redacted] (201-290405) ⁸
EPILEPSY
 Receiving outpatient treatment from Dade County Department of Public Health Anti-Convulsive Clinic. A Clinic report dated 31 May 1966 states that [redacted] continues to have seizures which the Clinic is attempting to control by medication. (Attachment A.) (U/S/C)

- b. [REDACTED] ⁸ (201-291762)
 CANCER/Bladder Removed
 Receiving outpatient treatment; most recently for a kidney infection. AMBUD-3 states that it is incredible that Subject continues to live. The case is summarized in a report prepared by Dr. Vargas in May 1966. (Attachment B) (U/S/C)
- c. [REDACTED] ⁸ (201-284434)
 MENTAL
 Receiving outpatient care at Jackson Memorial Hospital Department of Psychiatry. A 5 May 1966 report from the Hospital recommends that Subject continue under psychiatric outpatient care for at least another year. (Attachment C) (U/S/C)
- d. [REDACTED] ⁶ (201-299101)
 MENTAL
 Continuing to receive treatment from Dr. Mora who wrote on 11 August 1966 that Subject is very ill and in need of further psychiatric treatment. (Attachment D) (U/S/C)
- e. [REDACTED] ⁸ (201-292760)
 MENTAL
 Continuing to receive treatment from Dr. Mora who wrote on 11 August 1966 that Subject has shown signs of real improvement which may result in his becoming self-supporting. (Attachment E) (U/S/C)
- f. [REDACTED] ⁶ (Garcia Lines, 201 not available)
 BLIND (Advanced glaucoma)
 Receiving outpatient care at Jackson Memorial Hospital. (Attachment F) (U/S/C)

3. It is requested that the Headquarters reviewing ⁶action 6 described in Reference C for handling the cases of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] be expanded to include all the remaining cases and that JMWAVE be informed of the conclusions reached concerning the ultimate disposition of these cases.

4. FYI. An amount of \$250,000 was originally authorized for the medical phase of the AMBUD Program. Expenditures under this program have reached a level of approximately \$245,000 with bills outstanding at the present time of \$3,250. It is evident that the cases remaining which require medical treatment as outlined above will necessitate the expenditure of sums in excess of this amount.
