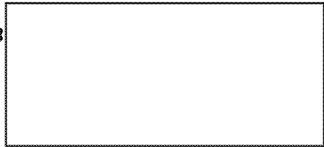

Dear Dr. Maceo:

As per your request in an attempt to secure further information regarding the duration of the disability on the above individuals South Florida Hospital, Dr. Lasaga, and Dr. Mora were contacted.

South Florida Hospital reported that [redacted] they thought, would be ready to go back for a trial visit in about one month. They had recently taken him off his medicine but he showed signs of deterioration at that point and they put him back on the medicine. Of course, he would not be eligible for rehabilitation in one month as the trial basis probably would be on week-ends or for a short period.

Dr. Mora was contacted in connection with [redacted] and [redacted] I could get anything whatever definite regarding [redacted] but in regard to [redacted] Dr. Mora thought that in a few months, he would be eligible for release depending on how well he did in the Barber course which he is starting on Monday October 5. He felt that Ortega's case might be longer.

Dr. Lasaga says that in the case of [redacted] he would recommend psychotherapeutic treatments for an ideal time of one year although in the event that only 3 or 4 sessions could be given him, he would favor this as better than nothing.
