to get his mother's permit extended without the necessity of her returning to Cuba. VALDES granted the request. identity added that ARANGO's mother now has a permanent extension of permission to live abroad and that the family property has not been confiscated (BUNCE Comment: LAPOTO shows that on 20 January 1565 Fleng ARANGO, the mother, telephoned the Embassy to the Golfand was told that she could send someone to pick it up, along with her passport. The muthorization was for three years and cost 14,240 line. The passport was issued to Elena ARANGO on 30 October 1959.)

6. Identity also provided the information forwarded in , 26 January 1965.

- 7. Identity next provided information about AMHIP/2. He said that the fnu (IGLESIAS) who deals with ANNHIP/2 (see OIRA-37855). 7 August 1964, not to Madrid or JMWAVE) that now become a Communist. He said that "not too long ago" [JULESIAS VISITED AWWIIP/2 at his home. (BUNCE Comment: AMWHIP/2 has not told BUNGE about such a visit.) Identity was well-aware of the jewelry transactions in which awwilp/1 and AWWIP/2 are engaged (see DIR-60438, 30 October 1964, not to and showed his annoyance. He said that AWWIIP/2 is not really a Cuban. He also said that in the summer of 1964 AMWHIP/2 and wife were visited at their home by Osmani CleveusGOS, Minister of Public Works. (BUNCE Comment: No record here.) Asked if he suspected AMWHIP/2 of being pro-Communist or pro-Castro, Identity said no, that he considered him only pro-profit. "He is a business man," said Identity, "and because he is not really a Cuban, he cannot be expected to feel as we do about these matters." Despite this tolerant statement, however, identity said that he now limits his verbal exchanges with AMWHIP/2 to good morning and good evening. He said that AMWHIP/2's wife seems pro-PBPRIME but talks too much. He added that when Chief of Staif Juan ALMEIDA Bosque became friendly with AMWHIP/2 and wife, the latter learned of underground construction going on near their home (they lived out of Havana) and now brags that she reported this to ODYOKE intelligent (BUNCE Comment: A recent letter to BUNCE from AWWHIP/2 says that he expected to be in Rome before 25 January 1965. When he arrives BUNCE intends to ask him for a full run-down on any and all Cubans. now living in Cuba who have visited him in Switzerland.)
- 8. Identity said that American Express credit cards are presently available only to persons who have bank accounts in dollars. American Express is planning to open credit card offices in ther countries and issue cards to holders of other currencies. Identity, who is not satisfied with his present salary, is being considered by American Express for the position of manager of the credit card business for Italy. If both sides come to terms, Identity will leave in March 1965 for two months training in the U.S. Upon returning to Italy he will be travelling busily for some time, setting up eight to ten credit card offices.
- 9. As this dispatch and reference show, Identity is a very promising potential asset. As soon as their relationship permits (probably during February 1965) we intend to formalize the recruitment and submit PRQ's. Unless contrary Headquarters instructions are received, we also intend to ask Identity what the difference is between his present salary and what American Express would pay him and offer to make it up (if it is not too great) on condition that he stay in Rome.
