MEMORARDAM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Cuban Revolutionary Activity in Plorida

- 1. On the evening of 4 January Mr. Rollie Atvood, Director of ICA for Latin America, telephoned me at my home and told me that he had received a telephone call from a Mr. Beed Whittel, a prominent Plorida rancher and former student of his, telling Atvood that he was in touch with certain people interested in overthrowing the Castro government and seeking Atvood's advice, Whittel said that he was in touch with Mr. Robert William's, Mr. Lymn of Labet Marginia Company and a United Fruit Company representative, all in Florida I that these gentlemen also had the backing of an undisclosed London benker, and their objective was to assacinate Fidel and Raul Castro, also the Guevarra, then take over the Cuben Government and place at its head one Francisco CANKAS; that Whittel wanted to know whether he should become involved in this or not. Atvood called me to give him guidance. I told Atvood the best I could do was to put Reichhardt, our Miami representative, in touch with Hhittel and have Beichhardt determine what Cuben group these people were connected with, and then we would proceed from these.
- 2. I then telephoned Mr. Reynolds, who called Reichbardt, and arrangements were made for Reichbardt to meet Whittel in Orlando, Florida, the following day. As a result of this meeting with Whittel, Reichbardt found out that the Cuban group these people were connected with is the Edda Fortuendo Cajigas group. Reichbardt esutioned Whittel as to the danger of getting involved in such revolutionary movements.
- 3. On 6 January I telephoned Atwood and told him that in our opinion the Munez Portuonio group was not one looked upon with favor; however, it was not up to us to tell Whittel that this group was looked upon with disfavor but that Atwood should get his guidance from Mr. Hill or Mr. Rubottom in State. In the meantime, I made John Hill aware of the foregoing.
- again and told me that Cillaspie (whom I later accertained to be identical with Jack B. Gillaspie, President of Dixio Industries, Inc., Atlanta, Georgia and who is in touth with and also in touch with the Bureau) had contacted him concerning participation in revolutionary activities of this group. Whittel said that other people involved were a Endolph Fernander and a Endolph Member; that the sims of the group were to hold elections after thirty months, during which time they would have U. S. advice: that they would have

that in order to accomplish this, the interested parties would make a contribution of \$5,000,000 and would be repaid at a reasonable rate of interest by the new Guban Government after it took over. Again, Atwood wished me to advise him as to what he should tell Whittel.

I told Atwood that as far as I was concerned, I could not tell him to give Whittle any further advice than that which Reichhardt had already given him; that I knew Gillespie to be a bons fide American businessman who was in touch with us and with the Bureau, and that Atwood should contact John Hill and get instructions from him.
