SUBJECT: Release of Information on Mexico City Teltaps

1. Protection of sources and methods require that references to the Mexico City Station teltap activity be excised from any documents released under the auspices of the JFK Assassination Record Collection Act of 1992. While the teltap activity mentioned in the documents under review occurred some thirty plus years ago,
2. Release of any information that would constitute official USG acknowledgment of the existence of the joint teltap operation would have a serious adverse impact on current poperations. Relations between the Station and the would be affected, with the likely outcome of discouraging from cooperating in similar ventures in the future with Mexico City Station. Official acknowledgment of the existence of the joint teltap in the 1960's would embarrass the iven Mexico's strong brand of nationalism and sensitivity towards the issue of sovereignty vis a vis the United States. probably would terminate its cooperation with the Station on the current joint teltap operation in order to be able to defend itself against domestic critics.
