: X Marvin KANTOS; Possible Connection to Investigation of Les Narvey and Marine OSWALD

- 1. Reference is made to your file number (S) 105-77772, subject: Harvin KANTUR and to your file number (S) 183-82555, subject: Lee Harvey 059ALD.
- 2. It may be of interest to year office to note the following coincidences in the backgrounds of EASTOR and Lee Bervey and Marine CSYALD:
 - a. As you know from previous correspondence togarding EASTOR, he reportedly was in Sinek, USSR, for six works during the summer of 1958 and during the period 2 June to 8 September 1959. Although OSKALD apparently did not arrive in Minek outil January 1960, Haring GSVALD, according to her own testimosy, arrived in Minek toward the end of August 1959.
 - b. In interviews on 3 and 4 May 1961, in Copenhagen, Denmark, with an employer of this Agency who was known to NASTOR as "a representative of American Intelligence". NASTOR claimed to have been something of an eddity in himsk mince he was the only American residing there at the time. As such, he claimed to have attracted to himself a group of young Soviets who displayed an unusual cariosity about the standard of living in the United States and Western Europa and whose interests centered around girls, cars, having a good time and listening to jazz music on the Voice of America. Among thuse young Soviets, according to SANTOR, was a young man asked Igor (LNU). "whose father was a Soviet army general". It is interesting that OSWALD also reportedly





considered himself to be an eddity as the only American residing in Minsk and attracted more or less the same type young Soviets as did KANTOR. It should be noted that OSWALD listed among his close friends in Minsk a young Soviet named Pavel COLOVACHEV, whose father ostensibly was a Soviet army general.

- c. Both KANTOR and OSWALD had served as enlisted men and technicians in the United States Marine Corps.
- d. According to a report from your Detroit office, dated 14 August 1964, KANTOR is employed by the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan, as a lecturer in Slavic languages and literature in the university's College of Literature, Science and Arts. According to press reports, Marina OSWALD is currently enrolled in a special English language course at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan.
