**REFERENCE:** Assistant to the Director for Planning  
**SUBJECT:** Arrest of CIA Agents by Cuban Security Police

1. This memorandum is for information only.

2. On 1 March 1955, a letter was received from  
 Informer reported that Major Rolando CULMA and Major  
 Joaquin GUIN were arrested on this date by the Cuban  
 Security Police for alleged counterrevolutionary activities  
 involving the United States Central Intelligence Agency.

3. Rolando CULMA (Deceased) and Joaquin VARGAS GUIN (CIA),  
 whose biographic sketches are contained in Appendices A  
 and B, respectively, were, in fact, involved with this  
 agency in counterrevolutionary activities. CULMA, who was  
 recruited by a CIA agent in August 1950 inside Cuba as a  
 liaison agent to recruit high level military leaders,  
 has had frequent contact with CIA staff personnel. In fact,  
 he was, and is, a material and enlisted by his recruiter  
 under Agency direction. No C/J contract had been made with  
 CULMA prior to 1950. CULMA, the name is reported to the  
 Agency, has been in contact with CIA Agents during the  
 above indicated (last contact in February 1955), during  
 which time he has been in direct contact with at least  
 ten agents of the Agency. Two of them were known to him by true  
 names, while others used aliases. Referring to the  
 Agency's operational contacts, which include Agent [redacted] (name  
 withheld in accordance with Executive Order 13526), Agent [redacted] (name  
 withheld) is a list of those officers who met with CULMA,  
 where and when they met, and the discussions.

4. In addition to the staff officers mentioned  
 above, CULMA also has contact with Agent [redacted] (name  
 withheld, inquire [redacted] (name withheld)) [redacted] (name withheld)  
 and with [redacted] (name withheld). Regarding the Agency's suggestion, that it be  
 credit to him that he did not represent the United  
 States Government.

NAME: Ramon Tomas GUIN Diaz

DPOB: 22 September 1933, Havana, Cuba

MARITAL STATUS: Wife - Daisy and 2 children

BIOGRAPHIC DATA: GUIN matriculated at the University of Havana School of Sugar and Agricultural Economy during the 1955-56 Academic year. He fled Cuba in July 1956, as a result of his political activities against BATISTA, obtaining asylum in the Costa Rican Embassy in Havana, and thereafter proceeding to Costa Rica. He later entered the United States at Miami and eventually went to New York to reside with an uncle. While in New York he carried on the struggle against BATISTA. He was secretary of the propaganda section of the Directorio Revolucionario (DR) and also director of its newspaper "El Combate". He then returned to Cuba, joining CASTRO'S forces in the Escambray as a Captain in the Rebel Army. After CASTRO'S victory he became Comandante (Major), manager of an INRA collective farm and Vice Secretary of Provincial JUCEI.

OPERATIONAL SUMMARY: GUIN was first contacted and recruited in August 1963 by [redacted] who was on an infiltration mission for CIA. GUIN was to be utilized as a Principal Agent for the purpose of recruiting dissidents among high level Cuban military officers. Rolando CUBELA Secades eventually became involved in the conspiracy with GUIN. GUIN was trained in secret writing and issued SW materials by the Agency but there has been no SW contact since July 1964.

DAMAGE POTENTIAL:

GUIN was never met by any Agency staffer. In the conspiracy part of the operation, GUIN'S only known contact was CUBELA. However, GUIN had many contacts especially in Matanzas and Garderas such as [redacted] family and friends with whom he maintained close relations.
