MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Operations (R. G. G.)
VIA Deputy Chief, NY/SA (H. C. C.)
SUBJECT: Handling of NY/SA Operators

1. During a meeting with Mr. Reed, C. G. G., Mr. Cizever, DC/ NY/SA and Mr. Swenson, C. G. G. on 20 June 1964, Mr. Swenson reviewed the following points concerning the handling of the NY/SA Operators. These points were the subject of earlier discussions by Mr. Swenson and the various Branch Chiefs in the Division.

2. From the subject of Mr. Reed's proposed action plan, the following have been:

a. To describe NY/SA's present and to get the information to the appropriate country desks as soon as possible. To run traces, including field traces, and to analyze the results. Traces to be run by NY/SA/CI on Cuban targets and by the host country desks on Cuban targets of their respective countries.

b. To select the best targets from the NY/SA's identified by NY/SA and to put them in order of priority, considering the overall time, chance of success, accessibility and personality. The selection of targets to be done jointly by NY/SA and the host desks.

c. To give consideration to appointing NY/SA agents to agents refer to the Cuban to NY/SA since the NY/SA are not able to do without NY/SA's description and data. It is to try to get a greater communication program in reporting back to NY/SA. The Cuban operators are to be transferred to NY/SA and NY/SA to transfer them to their respective countries and NY/SA to NY/SA.

(2) To use the CG-1 for drawing pictures of selected targets, agents first and staffers second as explained above.

c. To provide a list of names acquired from CG-1001 [redacted] [redacted] [redacted]

(1) To [redacted] [redacted] [redacted] [redacted] and to prompt them to take any action as we may wish.

(a) To give pertinent information [redacted] who can help us in locating and identifying targets.

u. Meanwhile, as in the [redacted] case for [redacted] defector who has provided us with considerable information and has been used in a number of approaches, to disseminate appropriate information to the [redacted] intelligence community, in the case of personalities, the CG-1 dissemination would consist only of over-type and descriptive data furnished by the [redacted], including appropriate headquarters traces. [redacted] would request information from them in return. (This procedure has been used in the [redacted] case.)

e. To decide what instructions we should give the various [redacted] [redacted]

f. To work out in cooperation with the CI and C-1 staffs what can be done in the event it may be useful at some future date to produce a list of the defectors by releasing certain information to the press or by possibly having him appear before the [redacted] of American states.

3. The above represents a general outline of what our overall planning has been in connection with the [redacted] exchange since its origin [redacted] to the United States. The role of [redacted] is to understand it to [redacted] and coordinate the overall aspects of the operation and to see that all ministerial actions taken by any one interested department since that [redacted] have been done in accordance with the operation.
