[redacted] received the letter quoted below for Gustavo AMOS y Bergnes, leader of the 26th of July Movement of Cuban revolutionaries in Mexico. The letter was signed by "Guillermo" with the return address as Arsenio VILLA, 411 S. W. 14th Street, Miami, Florida.

Dear Friend,

I believe I shall have time to get my work done here. I have spoken twice with Yopa on the telephone and tomorrow I am going to see her. She said that you haven't said anything about my negotiations (costly).

The possibilities are infinite here and what you intend to do there has been done three times recently without any difficulties. In fact, I intend to take advantage of one of these opportunities after I finish my mission here. The problem of money is the theme of the day. Tomorrow, I'll give you more information on these things. Williams said not to forget about putting Ing. Roberto CARRILLO of Caracas, in contact with the people from Venezuela. Regards to all ...

According to another usually reliable source, Manuel CAMACHO Rojas, another of the 26 of July Revolutionaries in Mexico, said that "Guillermo," a friend of "El Gallo," had arrived at his destination and was to ask CAMACHO by letter to send him certain things; and that if he needed more money he was to ask CAMACHO for it and CAMACHO would in turn be reimbursed by "El Gallo" by money order.
