The interesting thing is that while the Soviet Union only answered these accusations with an article in the; newspaper and expressed their sorrow in a meaningful manner by sending Deputy Prime Minister MIKOYAN to Washington, CASTRO considered it necessary to answer the accusations of the U.S. press officially as Prime Minister in a speech at a time When friends and enemies of the U.S. generally were expressing their respect for KENNEDY. Also interesting is the fact that he not only defended Cuba but the Soviet Union as well.
