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

Following the assassination of President Kennedy, he was never questioned by the FBI or the CIA in relation to either his own activities or those of Cuban groups with which he was associated.  A good person to speak with concerning CIA-Cuban activities in Miami would be a close friend of "was a very active member of the CIA."
