"The lunch was spent mostly in polite, friendly conversation. Golub remarked that now Moscow had given him the authority to give Americans visas without prior approval from Moscow. He stated that this would make his job much easier, and as long as he was convinced the American "dall" all right " he could give her a visa in a matter of minutes. When Costello mentioned that he had a personal friend coming to Helsinki for a visit in October, Golub stated that Costello should insist she see Leningrad and that if Costello would bring her to the Soviet Embassy,

" Since that ^(Sept 4) Evening Golub has only phone Costille once and this was on a business matter. Two Americans were in the Soviet Consulate at the time and were applying for Soviet visas through Golub. They had previously been in the American Consulate inquiring about the possibility of obtaining a Soviet visa in one or two days. Costille advised them to go directly to Golub and make their request, which they did. Golub phoned Costille to state that he would give them their visas as soon as they made advance Intourist reservations. When they did this, Golub immediately gave them their visas. "
