# Anti-Castro War Camp Ruled Out by Exiles

Anti-Castro Cubans and their American supporters have been forced to drop plans for a large guerrilla warfare training camp near New Orleans, The Herald learned Saturday.

The site, on the north edge of Lake Pontchartrain 40 miles north of New Orleans, was donated this spring by an anonymous U.S. businessman.

The training of anti-Castro Cubans and the camp itself were to have been commanded by Gerald Patrick Hemming, a 25-year-old soldier of fortune well known to Cubans here.

The "stop order" came from the Cuban Revolutionary Council's Miami headquarters which advised its New Orleans associates they could not support any clandestine training sites in the United States.

Preparations for activating the guerrilla warfare school were begun last February as New Orleans' Cuban colony began rounding up arms, ammunition and money for the venture.

Reportedly, they were successful in raising large sums of money and acquiring large stocks of late model weapons.

Patrick made innumerable trips between Miami and New Orleans during the past four months preparing the site, which is complete with an airstrip, for July occupancy.

Plans had called for the training of 50 to 75 Cubans in classes lasting from six to eight weeks.

At the completion of the "courses," the guerrilla fighters would have been ready to infiltrate Cuba where they would work with local underground leaders in sabotage and operations against Castro's army and militia.

Louis Rabell, the New Orleans representative of the Cuban Revolutionary Council headed by Dr. Miro Cardona, confirmed the Council had ordered the camp closed before

then another, Patrick finally settled upon the name "International Penetration Force" for his organization and began guerrilla training of Cuban refugees here with money supplied by the Cuban colony.

A 6-foot, 5-inch, 231 pounder, Patrick has abandoned the long hair, pointed beard and Australian bush hat he wore for more than a year during his early activities here.

A veteran of four years with the Marine Corps, he now dresses as unobtrusively as possible and is still considered one of the most ardent and effective Americans working with the anti-Castro forces.

public knowledge of the proposed camp became too widespread and the Council wanted to dodge any connection with a large scale operation on which the U.S. State Department and Central Intelligence Agency would frown.

Hemming, who operates under the name Jerry Patrick, has been active in anti-Castro activities here since late 1960. He had been in Cuba since 1958 with Castro's forces and defected.

HEWING, Gerald P.

A 23 yr old U.S. citizen born in Los Angeles, Calif. employed by FAB at San Julian as a parachutist. Engaged in training Nicaraguans. Also a flyer, was a Marine in Korea and at the Guantanamo Bay Base, and had been warned when he was fighter with CASTRO that he could lose his citizenship, but this was not important to him. Subj stationed in head of INTERPEN, has 20 members, planned to set training camp, purpose is to train Cubans in military tech, said he was in Cuba fr Jan 59 to Aug 60, commanding a Cuban Air Force Base and talked against American Imperialists. Subj ex-U.S. Marine, served 18 months Cuba Army (Paratroopers) & Cuba Air Force from Feb '59 to Aug '60. (Initial debriefs are in OO-B rpts #3/169,982, 3/170,124; 3/170,077)

Subj gives remarks about Nicaraguan revolutionists in Cuba; believes that Castro's brothers were. Subj currently resides in Alhambra, Calif.; states that his loyalty is to U.S. but interviewer feels that this is because subj feels that U.S. military methods are superior to any others; seems to be mainly interested in guerrilla warfare.

Subj erroneously referred to in OO-A(S) 3,170,536 as Jerry P. HEWING, Jr.) informed Monday, 20 Mar 61. Subj stated he going contact Jimmy SHERMET, 95 S.W. Penn St., Apt. 8, Miami, Fla. (Tele: Franklin 4-3265) & that these 2 men were going proceed w/plan of action aimed at organizing small grp of "professionals" (Experienced revolutionaries) who would attempt conduct certain reconnaissance operations on mainland of Cuba via parachute drops & either light plane or water pick-ups. Subj stated he wanted do what he could in Miami had joined various of these movements & were doing it more harm than good while bleeding off much of the available money. (OO-A 3/183,427, 31 March 1961)

Group of anti-Castro volunteers, called an Int-Continental Revolutionary Force (Interpen) is being organized in Southeast Miami in cluster of houses owned by "Middle-class" women. Most are Americans with leaders composed group includes Cuban-Americans, Venezuelans, Cubans and other anti-Communist. Interpenarrison is led by Jerry Patrick, your informant

HEWING, Gerald Patrick (Jr.)

Subj, more reliable if Hewing, officially acquainted with his men, who wear Marine fatigue uniforms and paratrooper boots purchased at Army surplus stores, are conducting civil defense survival training courses. Privately he admits that his fund is being drilled for commando-type action against Fidel Castro and to train Cuban rebel troops. (Washington Post, 28 June 61)

Subj described as a CASTRO G-2 infiltrator. People in Miami afraid to have against his because of his strong personality and influence he has over those under his jurisdiction. (NYC 1963, 29 Jun 61, 2/Contact OO report)

Subj is living in apartment house that James GILBY said wife are sharing. GILBY says that - is not associated in any anti-CASTRO activity in Miami with subj. (NY 77-197, 29 Nov 1961 Miami, Fla.)

Jim Bruce, Pat Stenachick and Bill Demsey, who wished to volunteer to fight for the liberation of Cuba, claimed to be friends of Gerald Patrick HEWING. (SOURCE: UMA-2192, 24 Aug 61; OCGI-3/767,435)

Subj wrote to Dave Hart, president, "Adventures, Inc." 5011 Hollywood Blvd. in name of mercenaries. Subj said Cuba was interesting in getting along in name of "Adventures" a small firm but INTERPEN wants to be in a position to secure but I don't see the way to do it.
