- 1. Reference is made to your cable (SALV) (LLA, concerning Dunice ODIO. 196, 1 October 1947 stated that among the vertous prises given by the Queteralan Coverment for proce and poetry, one price was awarded, in the last week of September to a young Costa Rican were barred Eurice (UDIO.
- 2. During her stay in Gustemala City after receiving the sward, Senorita ODIO gave two recitations of beit poems. One was given in the CTG assembly hall, and the second was given before the Faculty of thesenities of the San Carles University. There, she was presented by the Customalan post, Miguel Angel ASTURIAS.
- 3. Miss ODIO's style is distinctly Merudian. This is not strange, as she is a very active Communist in Costa Wila, being a member of the famous Communist literati cell - Eugenio Maria de Hostos-to which Corina Rodrigues also balongs.
- 4. Bunice ODIO was described in 1947 as being about twenty-five years of age, white, with black hair and black eyes, about five feet five inches tall, and weighing approximately 118 pounds. She is of attractive appearance and wears her hair long, which extends half way to her waist. Her platform personality is pleasing, and her voice, which is the most attractive feature, easily captivates her audiences, because of its low scothing tons.
- 5. Har fanaticies for the cause of Communica and her work and efforts were fully appreciated by the so-called Polithuro of the Partido Vanguardia Popular in Costa Rica.

6. SANJ-133, IN-28963, 21 Movember 1947, mentioned a letter written by Joaquin GUTIERREZ Mangel, man of the Costa Rican Ambasandes to Washington, addressed to Bunice CDIO in which he special highly of Coving ROBIGUE, wallknown Costs Rican Communist. The course continued by saying that young

GUTIERFEZ was a suspected Communist and that his close association with Communists such as Corina ROERIGUEZ and Europe UDIO strengthened the suspicion.

7. In a rather complicated document, TLR-1191, 18 September 1950, which went to (San Jose and Lima) but not to (San Salvador) the Colombian shipments in Costa Rican territory which are rumored may be intended to reach Colombia. He was sent to Costa Rica and made a general report covering the arms shipments, the involvment of the Caribbean Legion, the infiltration of the Legion by Communists, and the Costa Rican Communists who were involved.
