<p>1. During Brigitte F. WASSERLAUF's visit in March 1966, she mentioned Subject to the JAGUAR analyst assigned to Second Chief Directorate activities. The latter has now written a summary of information from JAGUAR files on Subject and attached three photographs of Subject which are transmitted herewith.</p> <p>2. JAGUAR states:</p> <p>"When (WASSERLAUF) was here last March, one of the INDEX cards which she looked at was for SHIRAKOVA. Since then I have discovered that SHIRAKOVA figures in the Warren Report as the Intourist guide provided for Lee OSWALD on his arrival in Moscow in October 1959. Our information about her is briefly as follows:</p> <p>"SHIRAKOVA has come to our notice as the friend of two British brothers who first visited the Soviet Union in 1960. She and a male guide joined the party with which the brothers were travelling at the Russian border. One of the brothers, who has pursued the friendship more than the other, considers he made the running, not SHIRAKOVA. He claims that relations between them have become affectionate, but are platonic. In fact since he first met SHIRAKOVA she has married and had a child, and our source visits their home when he goes to the Soviet Union. They also maintain a steady correspondence.</p> <p>"After the birth of her daughter in October 1963, 1963 SHIRAKOVA, now Mrs. ZHITROOK, wrote that she had left Intourist and was employed as a teacher of English in a Moscow teachers' training college.</p> <p>"The two brothers last visited the ZHITROOKS at their home in a new housing estate in Moscow in August 1963. One of the things Rima showed them was an album of coloured post-cards of places in the U.S.A. which she claimed had been sent her by an American in return for money she had lent him when he was visiting the Soviet Union and ran short of funds. Unfortunately our source was not able to discover the name of the American or anything about him.</p>
