Summary of traces to FBI

1. We would appreciate receiving any traces on Subject, subsequent to your letter of 23 June 1969 (File No. 105-79059), which forwarded a negative trace on Subject in response to our CSCI-3/775,084 of 16 June 1969.

2. Subject was born on 4 September 1929, a U.S. citizen, and is married to a French citizen, Marie Christine, nee LAVERGNE, born 23 October 1937, in France. They reside at 10 Quincey Gardens, London, S.W. 7, and have at least one child born in 1963 in London. Subject is currently the head of Express Bureau in London and a member of the Foreign Press Association (to which a number of Soviet press and radio correspondents belong).

3. Subject has twice been stationed in Moscow, first with UPI in about 1961-62, and then with Express in about 1962-63. Between these two assignments, he took a course in Russian studies at Harvard under a Nieman Fellowship. He speaks Russian. On more than one occasion, Subject ran into difficulties with Soviet authorities during his stay in Moscow. While in Moscow in 1963, he was present in the apartment of Soviet author, Andrei ANATOLIK, when it was raided by the Soviet authorities.
