

NOTES ON THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Citizenship Status of Bernard Lewis Parker, Jr., #3-151647

1. On 4 August, Mr. Edward Ward and Mr. Tracy conferred with Mr. Warner and Mr. O'Neill of the General Counsel's office on the subject of restoration of citizenship of Bernard Parker. For further information see a memorandum, dated 14 July 1959, which summarizes the previous steps taken to restore this citizenship and a memorandum, dated 17 July 1961, giving Mr. Parker's statement to the Office of Security in regard to his case. These documents are in the subject's 202 file. Mr. Warner recommended that we query Mr. Murphy of the Alien Affairs Office to get the maximum background on the situation before any further efforts are made to restore restoration of subject's citizenship. Any information received should be passed to Mr. O'Neill of the Office of the General Counsel, Room 202, East Building.

2. On 11 August, Mr. Tracy conferred with Mr. Murphy of the Alien Affairs Office on the subject of restoring subject's citizenship. Mr. Murphy was unable to furnish any information on the subject of restoration of citizenship. He stated that he had no record of any application having been filed by subject. He recommended that we query the Office of Security to determine if subject has ever applied for restoration of citizenship.

3. On 11 August, Mr. Tracy conferred once again with the Office of Security on the subject of restoration of citizenship. It was agreed to have Mr. Murphy of the Alien Affairs Office contact Mr. Parker to ascertain his current information on the subject of restoration of citizenship. It was also agreed to have Mr. Murphy contact Mr. Parker to determine if Parker has ever applied for restoration of citizenship. It was also agreed to have Mr. Murphy contact Mr. Parker to determine if Parker could be located and interviewed concerning his present status.

4. On 12 August, Mr. Murphy of the Alien Affairs Office advised that no application for restoration of citizenship had been received from the subject. It was also determined that the subject had never applied for restoration of citizenship. Mr. Murphy stated that the subject had been interviewed by the Office of Security in 1959 and that he had been advised that he had been born in the United States. Mr. Murphy stated that he had no record of any application having been filed by the subject.

The alternative of having subject leave the country may be considered.
This would be a difficult procedure and it would detract from time available
for investigation.

It is recommended that the above information be referred to the Office of
the Director of Central Intelligence and a check made with the Office of Security and Civil Defense.
I would be able to give no new information since the case was submitted to the DDCI
in December. It is recommended that the Office of the Director of Central Intelligence be advised
as to the possibility of investigating a case which would require the services of the FBI.
