PEACRARIUM OF HISIT TO: Evelio Duque (No address available)

- 1. On 5 June 1961 at the request of MHD, Q Meurice Humsher of the Mismi Field Office acted as an interpreter in a Sebriefing interview with Evelio Duque, an Escambray resistance leader. Duque, an assistant, and an underground worker were brought to the US in a finhing lausch. They arrived in Key West and were brought to Mismi by the US Border Patrol. The interview was held in Border Patrol offices. Others present were Walter Koch of WHD and of Security.
- 2. The purpose of the interview was to secure some information in order to begin establishing whether or not the Subject was Evelic Duque as he claimed. The Subject did not provide detailed accurate information. He talked in generalities, and he was losthe to provide names. The interview lasted about two hours and little real information was gashed.
- 3. Subject and his group were returned to the custody of Border Patrol officials who released them to secure lodging for the night. Subject said he had US \$200. It was suggested to Subject that the group go to a nearby motel rather than a downtown hotel. It was also suggested that the group not go shopping in Mismi for new clothes.
- 4. It was later ascertained that the group contacted one FAU Garcia, a former Cuben Intelligence Service officer under Muchado, the new resides in Missi. The group apparently spent the night at Garciaks house. The following norming all members of the group had new clothing.
- 5. I returned to Border Patrol et 0930 hours on 6 Jun 61. The nambers of the group were photographed and filled out PEQ statements. Koch and a Mr. Rewett were present. It was evident that my services as an interpreter-debriefer were not needed. I gave Koch a copy of the notes I had made the previous day and left.
- 6. Subject appears to be a poorly educated middle class or lower class person. He is 34 years old, strong and muscular. He is about 5' 6" or 7" and would weigh about 175-180 points. He has a deep scar on his chin, and the ends of his fingers on both hands turned up sharply at the first joint as if they had been broken at some time and had not healed properly.

7. I cannot evaluate Subject's claim to be Evelio Duque. By his own statement he knows there are Cubans in Mismi who can identify him. It therefore appears probable that Subject is Evelio Duque.
