Reference is made to a verbal request to you from the DC/OS for information reparding any American citizens who have defected to the USSR, Red China, or other Satellite countries during the past sighteen months—other than Bernon F. MITCHELL and William H. MARTIN, and five other defectors regarding whom Mr. OTEPKA of the State Department Security Office already has information (i.e. Robert Edward-WEBSTER, EE-13854; Lee Harvey OSYALD, MS-11164; Libero KICCIARDELLI, MS-8295; Vladimir SLOBODA, MS-10565; and Joseph DUTKANICZ, MS-10724).

tecurity files reflect that the subjects of the attached memoranda are additional American citizens who have defected to the Soviets or their Spiellites during the past eighteen months.

Several of the above referred to defectors have been of interest to CLA:

lierbert Lee NORTHRUP, 48923, was a staff employee of this Agency from May 1951 to May 1959. A more detailed summary than that included in the attached group has been propered on him.

Robert Edward WEBSTER, EE-18852, and Nicholas PETRULLI, EE-19439, were subjected CO/C requests on 29 May 1959 and 15 June 1939, respectively, with a view to their being debrisfed upon their returns from violes to Russia. Neither was interviewed by CIA, either before or after their visits.

Here he had contact with at loast one representative of CIA and was in a position to have learned the identities of CIA personnel at the EGIS Center.

Edward NIXON, on 6 September 1969, approached a CIA agent in Fraudy's Bar in Damascus and engaged him in conversation, following which our agent found himself under curveillance. The surveillance continued for two days, after which our agent was approached in Fraudy's Bar by an unknown G-2 officer who saked him about MIXON; and thereafter the surveillance cassed. (The owner of Fraudy's Bar had reported MIXON to G-2, as he said he was raining his business.)

while defectors to Cuba and the UAR may not technically be defectors to Seviet balefillic countries, it seems a close thing, and the names of such known defectors to the past eighteen mentas have been included in this memorandum.
