l. Subject was born in Vienna, Austria, on a January 1900, as
Hedwig TUEE, the descriptor of Philip and Rose (nee EURENSTEIN). She attended grammar school, high school, and dramable school in Vienna, and at
18, went to what was then Peland for a year to play with a stock company.

- 2. She toured Coordeslovatia the following year with the company, and ca returning to Vienna, not derhart RIGLES, whom she married in 1920. The couple went to Berlin where RIGLES was editor of a Communist paper. Subject played on the German stage for about it years. After three years of married life (during which time she had become a Communist and had been active in Communist Party work) she and RISLES esparated.
- S. Shortly thereafter, she fell in love with Dr. Julian BOMPERTS, an American citisen, who spent much time in Germany. A Communist, SCHPETS was co-editor of a book publishing concern, "Mailk Veriag," a known Party left-wing publishing firm, under the influence of the Communist Party. In 1926 Subject divorced RISLVE and married SCHPERTZ for whom she had been working several years prior to their marriage.
- 4. Subject and GORPHHI went to Paris after their marriage and them to the U.S., arriving on the S.S. Isviathan. After a brief stay in Hew York, they went to San Francisco and lived with GORPHHI! made. In 1927 they returned to Greenwich Village, Hew York, where they associated with many Communists. In January 1928 the couple returned to Rurope, to Frankfort/Main, where GEPIRTI worked for the Institutes of Social Research.

7. In October 1933 Subject came to the U.S. to rency her American passport. She had become an American citizen through her marriage to Company, having been naturalized 9 December 1937, in white Plains, New York. Prior to coming to the U.S. in 1933, who visited the Pischins for two weeks in Moscow. In New York she lived at the Breveout Hotel for a short time, and then, at the sparturent of <u>Elica/BLACE of Sevicts</u>, where she was contacted by <u>William Josephy Brewiss</u>, a <u>Sevict agent</u>. The did no active work for Brewiss at the tive, but returned to Burope the latter part of the year, picked up her husband from a Serona concentration camp, and returned with him to the U.S. in January 1924. Subject stayed in New York while her husband went to teach at Commonwealth College in NewA. Arkaneas.

8. while in New York, Subject was in frequent touch with william Joseph BYELEK and Arthur PALTER, for whom she acted as courier to Paris in August 1934. On her return from France in the fall, she met neveral new Russian agents, among whom were Gerda FIA*KY MTTR, "BILL", "RORIS" (FALM OFFI), and "ATTOR". Subject worked with these people until the summer of 1937. It was to "BILL" that Subject furnished the name of Loel FILL in 1936 as a possible contact. "PORIS", "RILL" as associate in the U.S., was against immediate development of FI'ID, and no action was taken until Paul "Acci" contacted FIELD in Paris.

as courier between the 1.7. and that city and also furnished information about news of the day from the "Dev York Times". In the summer of 1927 MASTIMU returned from Europe, about which time he and subject received a letter from Ignata EUICO advising that ERISS had braken with the Bussians. As they had worked with FEISS, they agreed that they too were through with Euseia. Soon thereafter, the MASSINGS were contacted by "BURIO" and a "MASTIM" (hrs. Varially Eucling) who tried to influence them to go to Koscow. Although the MASSINGS suspected that Moscow wanted to liquidate them, they decided to go anyway, but traveled on their American passports, arriving in Loscow on 5 June 1927.

10. During their seven-month's stry in Koscov, they were interrogated about FIRS and his associates. In June 1978 they left Eussia and broke with the Soviets. They have lived since than in New York City and in Pennsylvania. Periodically they have received visits and calls from verious Soviets indicating that the Russians are keeping a check on them. In 1946 the FIRIDs contacted the MASTIRGS and were told that they (the MASTIRGS) had broken with the Soviets and did not want to be molested by the FIRIDS again.

11. Subject has worked as a translator, boarding-lyane keeper, shippard worker, and personnel supervisor. She has also worked for Jowish Charity from January to April 1946. Rost of her time is now taken up with the operation of her boarding house.

in. Subject's former husband, Julian CORPERT, is currently running a book shore to 610 Fifth twenue, Bew York, and is Financial Advisor to the School of Social Research. According to Subject, JORPERTE broke with the Communists in 1926.
