Sometime between May 1975 and January 1976 while an Office of Security employee assigned to the Security Records Division file room, was requested to search SANCA in the name of Lee Harvey OSWALD. This request was in connection with a Freedom of Information case involving OSWALD, and believed that also assigned to the Security Records Division; made the request This search met with positive results, thus making aware of the fact that OSWALD's name was entered in SANCA.
