The following information on Subjects has been received

On & Hovember 1958 Hollie BLOCK (born 6 November 1911 in New York), holder of American passport No. 116708, left Schiphol Airport in Amsterdam on a KLM flight bound for Hoseow via Warsaw. She traveled with her shild Johanna Horris BLOCK, born in 1950, who was send to be in possession of a Greek passport. Mrs. BLOCK had esiginally planned to fly to Hoscow on 2 September, but her trip was postpured by the circumstances outlined below.

3. On 30 August 1958 Morris BLOCK, husband of Mollie BLOCK, corrived at Amsterdam on a KLH flight from Hontreal. BLOCK was desaying American passport No. 921617, issued 12 April 1956 but changed by him to remi 12 April 1958 se that it would appear to be still valide. Morris BLOCK was refused entry to The Metherlands on the basis of his falsified passport. The American Commulate in Amsterdam validated his passport for a single return trip to New York, and he was sent mak to New York on a KLM plane at 2359 hours on 30 August 1958.

he Merrie MACK was born in New York on 30 March 1920; he is a mebinist by secupation, and his home address was given as 250 Corbin Place, Ercoklyn, Hew Tork. BLOCKS's passport carried the following

BLOCK stated to the Datch passport control officer that he had visited the USSR 25 July 1957 - 15 October 1957 as a delegate to the World Youth Festival held in Hostow in 1957. BLOCK stated it was his plan to travel from The Netherlands to Hoscow and to settle himself and his family there. He said his visa for Bussia was ready at the Seviet Embassy in The Hague and that since he was not permitted to obtain a new valid passport, he had changed the date of issuance of his former passport to make it appear to be still valid. Since he had not known for sure that he would be allowed to depart from the United States, his wife and child were to take a later plane to Amsterdam after his wife knew he had reached Ganada. He said that he had been unemployed in the United States and that his wife had had to support the family on her salary of \$65 a week.

- Was only one country in the world where freedom was really possible, and that he wished to go there. He no longer wanted to live in America, for the laws were made there by three or four families and the rest had to fall in line. He had had more than enough of the slique around Eisenhower. He stated he no longer valued his American mationality and asked if they could not admit him so that he could apply to the Russian Embassy. He said his wife had the money and theksets for the trip to Moscow from Amsterdam.
- 6. BLOCK had with him a suitease and a cage with a parrety his wife was to take the rest of their belongings with her. Also in his possession were:
 - Bepartment Store Union, AFL-CIO, 13 Aster Place, New York 3, Assessed to Morris BLOCK 236 Corbin Place, Brooklyn 35, Newbership number 58923, membership paid up to 25 August 1958. In addition, he carried a District 65, AFL-CIO Employment Office Guide giving a registration date of 29 July 1958.
 - Do Mirth certificate No. 14861, issued by State of Tow Book certifying the birth of Morris Block on 3 March 1930.
 - See Two visiting sards on which were: SH 35145 and SE 31054.
 - G. A small pin with the legend "VIth World Feetival of Youth

7. BLOCK also threw many a used piece of earbon paper which he shviously did not want to have with him or his return to the USA. The earbon read as follows:

8. BLOCK had \$63 with him. A room had been reserved at the Metel Krasmapolaky in Amsterdam for him and his wife, mines they had plasmed to travel together to Moscow on 2 September 195t. On his departure for the United States, BLOCK excelsined as follows: "Oh, most I have to go back to the United States, but I have no money and I also had not paid for the trip, as what more can happen to me?"
