Your letter of February 4 makes me so envious that in one sense I was sorry to receive it. Your trip with Dr. Vandever is one of those things we all dream about and I imagine that even Errol Flynn is turning over in his grave.

I hope I do hear from Climard but since I don't want to cause you any embarrassment, I would like to summarize my feelings in a few words:

A) I am deeply interested in the business proposition we discussed. This would particularly be so for the timber.

B) I just don't have the ability that other people possess and may be necessary to wait around with BSAM.

As you know this group of ours is going to be down in the Bahamas the week-end of the 20th and while this is really not an opportune time for me to be away from Dallas, if some firm indication could be developed from the Minister of Finance it might be possible to take advantage of that shortened distance.

We had a ball last Saturday evening at Adella's party. They had a Latin American band from Fort Worth which was just tremendous, even though they had to turn down our request for a merengue.

I bumped into Steve Fuqua last night at a meeting of the geophysicists. He exuded great prosperity and mentioned a major discovery in Hartman County. I gathered from a delicate probe or two that he and Irene must be finis.

I have your letter of February and thanks again for your kind invitation. I hope we can have a short visit in a not too distant future. Or may be you will come to New York some day, too..?

Haiti is very much in the news these days, but it still has not too good a "press" in the business world. And the recent Affaire Fayed did not help... In my humble opinion, with Haiti so near, the US will have to reconcile themselves to the situation and assist that country, in order to avoid having another Cuba.,.

Recently I have been instrumental in bringing together 3 separate groups of people-in New York /Petroleum-Investments/, in Los Angeles /Mergers, international Management Consulting, development, financing etc/ and in the Middle West /Promotion, Real Estate investing with multi million capital behind, etc/. A separate corporation is to be set with offices probably in Rockefeller Center-N.Y. Among them are men familiar with international business and mining, oil, development and also familiar with Haiti, Dominican etc.

Mr. Terman managed to attract the police by honking his horn, while the Doberman still sat contentedly.


