MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Views of AMEAL-3 on Current Cuban Exile Situation

1. The next logical action for AMCIAR and the one most urgently needed is the selection of a single chairman to replace the rule-by committee that is now employed by AMCIAR.
2. The most obvious choice for chairman is AMEAL.
3. Because of the bitter personal differences between AMEAL and AMEP, the selection of AMEAL as chairman could very well bring about the resignation of AMEP from AMCIAR. This would not in the least weaken AMCIAR and might in fact strengthen it.
4. The views expressed above are those of AMEAL-3, who made a special trip to the Headquarters area on 1 September to meet Paul J. REED and discuss these matters with him. The meeting lasted from 1630 until 1930 hours in a local hotel room.
5. As AMEAL-3 sees it, the selection of a single chairman would automatically solve several of the current problems of AMCIAR. For example, it would speed the decision-making process. It would force AMCIAR to work for the common good rather than his own partisan political interests. It would present the uncommitted Cuban exiles with a strong personality around whom they could rally in the traditional Latin pattern.
6. AMEAL-3 paints quite an encouraging picture regarding the Miami office of AMCIAR, but he says the good talent assigned by the majority of AMCIAR to head up the Miami office is being frustrated by the unilateral actions of AMCIAR-1, who refuses to be bound by decisions which AMCIAR took in his absence. See good examples are the following:
- a. AMCIAR names AMCIAR-1 chose MIRANDA Vero (fina) as head of the Communications Committee. MIRANDA Vero is a graduate of MIT and an instructor there. He was granted leave without pay by MIT to accept the AMCIAR post. AMEAL-3 has the highest respect for him. However, when AMCIAR-1 returned to Miami he immediately insisted on putting one of his men, CAPU (fina), in as head of the Communications Committee. CAPU was formerly a part of the ~~other~~ organization of the 50 of July movement. He operated in Cartagena. He is probably well-qualified for the job but he is completely loyal to AMCIAR-1 and was ~~not~~ the choice of AMCIAR for the chairmanship.
- b. Colonel MARTIN Diaz is an outstanding figure and the best possible choice to head up the military committee. Although he was only issued a written verbal invitation to leave Cuba and join AMCIAR by AMCIAR at the outset, his response was immediate acceptance, to the surprise of AMCIAR. Since his arrival in Miami he has impressed

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AMEMBASSY and others as a strong leader, honest, dedicated and professionally competent. Once again, however, AMEMBASSY wishes to replace MACTIB with Colonel Oscar DIAZ. A struggle for power is under way between MACTIB Elizalde and DIAZ, much to the detriment of AMEMBASSY's military effort.

7. At the instructions of the AMEMBASSY members in Mexico, AMEMBASSY was to arrive in Miami on 31 August to put AMEMBASSY in his place... AMEMBASSY is hopeful that this meeting will have the desired effect. He has promised to provide a private report on the outcome to AMEMBASSY.

8. Among the other five members of AMEMBASSY there is good faith. They do not see eye to eye in all matters, but they are willing in the interest of unity to resolve their differences in a civilised manner.

9. In reply to a query concerning Major Raul CHIRIBAS, AMEMBASSY-3 gave an unfavorable description. He called CHIRIBAS a person of little moral fiber who has been trying, without success, to form a competing organization headed by himself, AMEMBASSY and AMEMBASSY-2.

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
