On 17 July 1959 Offwood telephoned me that he had just been contacted by an individual named Dick O'CONTRAL from Havans, the said that he had a message for MARSOR from LOTHAR CHARGOR wanted to know: a) if I knew O'CONTRAL; and b) what he should do about this telephone sail. I told him I didn't know O'CONTRAL but by all nears to go and neet him to see what message he was carrying. I net with of the second and the second had talked with o'constant. Mach he could not reach [MALLE, who is mentioned in the message, O'COMMENT called Thecor.

O'CONTELL informed CDARBOR that she ld they wish to make contact with ODCHAR it should be through Jorge and Virgilio VILLANA, who could be reached on telephone 3-4720 or 3-5753, Havana. O'CONTRLL said also that having delivered this message he did not wish to have anything further to do with this matter.

3. Both CDREOR and CDALLM were able to identify positively that the signature was that of COCHR. It then became a question of whether or not we wished to take any action to assist in the escape of QDCHAR from Cura. In a series of telephone exchanges with LERANOW during the night of July 17-13, I was informed that we were going shead with an attempt to effect the escape of CDCHAR and it was agreed that it would be best for CDAHM and CDAHMS to proceed to Havena as quickly as possible and there to be placed in contact with members of the Havana Station to work out the next moves.

4. QUARECR and CHALLEM departed Miami in the late afternoon of 13 July 1959. They returned to Mismi on the evening of 19 July and reported that everything had gone very satisfactorily. The details of their contact with the Station and with QDCHAR and the arrangments made with the Station for moving QDEAR are reported in correspondence from the Havana Station. Similarly, the announcement from Havana that CDCHAR would depart Havana 25 July and arrive at Tampa 2" July, and the initial arrangements for moving QDCMAR directly from Farma to the Washington area are contained in cable treffic between H vana, Panara, and Washington.

5. QDCHAR arrived in Tampa on schedule aboard the SS ROADAN and, in accordance with prior arrangements made with Mr. GALVEN of the INNS, Tamps, he was arought from the ship to the ICNS offices. Based on the instructions that GDCHAR was to be handed over immediately into my custody for transfer to the Washington area, ISMS prepared a parole document in the name of JIMENE F Gomez which said only that he would appear for hearing at such time as the IMS called him. Meantime, Mr Joseph BRANKIGAN, who had arrived in Tampa the previous day, was prepared to escort QDCHAR to the Washington area aboard an Eastern Airline's flight on the afternoon of 27 July 1959.

6. Upon completion of IMMS documentation I took QDCHAR to ERABUTEAN'S room and left him in his care while I murchased clothing, toilet articles, a small before their scheduled departure, however, suitease, etc., for QDCMAR. Shortly a message was releived through EMMHG/N's channel that the decision to transfer DOMAR to the Washington area had been reversed and that he was to be held here in this area. We were also informed that Earl N. SADELLY and USEN FOR EVANS were enroute from Washington to Tampe to ecudust an interrogation of CDCEAR and to assist me in holding CDCHAR until he could be surfaced. SADELLY and Experien arrived 2) July. Since BRACHIGAN's services were no longer required, he departed

that same day for Washington. BRANNINAM's office might be notified that his assistance there was excellent. He was most willing and cooperative throughout and very effective in keeping QDCHAR at ease.

- 7. It wastinen agreed that SADELLY and Evenue would remain in Tampa with QDCHAR through that right (23 July) during which time they would have simple opportunity for interrogation, that I would return to Miami immediately to prepare a safehouse and to make the necessary arrangements with IANS and that SADELLY would bring QDCHAR to Miami on 29 July 1959.
- 3. On the morning of 29 July, I informed Mr. Edward AHRENS, ISNS Mizzi, what had taken place and that GDCHAR would remain in this area and I would make him available to him at any time that he wished. Mr. ARRENS said he would leave this entirely to me and would prepare to take the next steps in the ISMS handling of QDCHAR at my convenience. I also informed ODMNYY and offered them the opportunity to meet with QDCHAR. They had not yet received any instructions from their Headquarters on this matter and felt that, since we had already conducted an interrogation they could defer their meeting with QDCHAR until sometime when he could be see made more easily available, an attitude which was particularly appreciated at this time and in these circumstances
- 9. I then prepared EDLIM's apartment, which fortunately he had left for my use, as the safehouse for INCEAR and SADELLY, and notified SADELLY that he could proceed as planned on 29 July. They arrived in the evening of 29 July without incident and were settled in CDAHAW's apartment.
- 10. Mearwhile I was informed that the Havana Station's plans for moving QDCHAR's family out of Cuta had hit a snag in that, in order to obtain a passport for the children to leave Ciba, a written statement from QDCHAR granting his permission would be required. The covious problem here was the risk of confirming to the Cuben government that QDCHAR was in the US, which might result in blocking the family from leaving Cuba. At first it had been thought that this turn of events would alarm GDCEAR, but he accepted the news with complete calm, saying that he had expected this to happen. He also said he did not relieve that his status with the Cuban government would hause them to prevent his family from leaving. In orderto give this problem thorough consideration, however, it was thought best to have Stanley R ZANKA, who was in contact with QDCHAR's wire and who had the complete information on the problem as it existed there, come to Miami for a discussion.
- 11. ZAMMA arrived on 30 July 1959 in the afternoon. He confirmed to us the problem as it had been previously outlined, and said that there seemed to he no escape from this requirements. ZANKA also carried with him a letter to OCHAR from his wife in which she stated in effect that she did not think there was any cause for great alarm and obviously shared QDCHAR's own opinion that the government would not act to prevent her and the children from Leaving the country notwithstanding QDCHAR's status with the Cubon government. ZANKA had also reported that QDCHAR's wife was very much at ease and did not seem to be very worried about this as a problem. QDCHAR was informed that this was a decision that he must make since the risks were his. It was rather quickly agreed that we should proceed with the preparation of a written statement giving permission for his wife to obtain the necessary documents to transport the children from Cuba at any time and to whatever country she wished which ZANKA could take back with him.
- 12. Having reached this decision through which the Cuban government whuld be specifically put on notice that QDCHAR is in the US, there was no longer any necessity for holding him in the safebouse. I informed Mr. AFREIS immediately that CHAR would be presented to them the next day, 31 July 1959, whereupon he would assume a routine status. Annual vas told that although we had chosen to surface @CHAR at this time, we still were anxious to avoid any publicity, that we had reason to believe the Cuban poverment has assumed for quite a long time that DEMAR was in the US, and that we wail prefer that this impression be maintained. AERS fully apprecinted this and offered very kindly not to make any statements whatsoever about QDCEAR, to issue his parole document in the same name of JERNEZ y Gomez rather than his true name, and placed the file in his own restricted files so that it could not be discussed by anyone in IMS but himself.
- 13. There remained then only one problem which was to assist ODCHAR th learning the whereabouts of DRIAS. He had with him only an address which he told me was

7991 3.th Street, and that this was the address of the house which he had bought about three months ago with a \$1,000 downgayment through a real estate agent named MCNTARE in Coral Gables. Es cald that he thought that Frank FICKENI would be living in the house since he had asked him to look out for it for him and he hoped that FIORINI was raking the monthly payments on the mutuage. I told QDCHAR I would try to find out about the house, but since it appeared that PICRIM might be living there, I didn't try very hard. A superficial check showed that there is no address of 7051 30th Street or Averue in the northwest pertiin and there is no real estate agent named FENTERE listed as such. I was, however, very anxious to find QDEIAS because: a) I was anxious to the establish contact with him; and b) I wanted to drumatize the delivery of CDTEAR to him. Home of the US agencies who might normally be expected to know the whereabouts of such a person did in fact know where QDBIAS was. (Several of them who obviously read Drew Pearson's column said they thought he was in Texas). I rejurtantly turned to Captain Lee NAPIER of the Miami Police Detective Firce, who did know where he was and gave me the telephone and address and got wiri to QDBIAS that I was roming to see him. I found QDELAS living with Ricardo is LORIE in a small house on the far end of Key Biscayne. When I arrived, QDEIAS did not show any particular enthusiasm over seeing me again, but his attitude changed abmostly when I informed him that I had gotten QDCHAR for him and would bring him out that evening.

14. QDCEAR was taken to IMMS on the afternoon of 31 July where he was inxediately given his hearing, which normally requires an interval of 3-4 days, and the whole process completed on that one visit. I also introduced him to an agent of ODETA and they made their arrangements for interview for the morning of 3 August. (QDCEAR later reported to me that this interview had gone very well). His written permission for his wife to move the children was notarized by a clerk in ODENAY.

15. I then took QDCER out to Key Biscayne to De LORIE's house and arrived to find the whole entourage (i.e., in addition to De LORIE and CDSIAS and their wives, De LORIE's children and a nattery of "criados") was packed and ready to move. During my visit in the morning I had not spoken with De LORIS and maybe QDBIAS was too excited to mention this little matter of moving. In any case, De LORIE, who chricusly is the brainlest of the group, informed me of the obvious thing-that they were moving-end readily offered me their new address. The address is 0315 S# 42nd Street, Miami 5, which De LORIE said "they" had just bought. (I will learn more about this later out raybe they used the \$2000 that QDBLAS got from his article which he insidentally proudly showed me. I had the impression that QDBIAS finds that publicity very heady stuff.) In any case, I spoke with the three of them together and briefly referred to my desire to continue contect with them and my feeling that we could work effectively together. This brought a modding of heads and an apparent eagerness to do st. QDCHAR was instructed to inform me as soon adthey octain a telephone at this new address, which they didn't expect was going to be defore 5 August. It is not possible to tell at this time what sort of cooperation we are going to get from this trio, cut I think CDCHAR might be counted on to maintain contact. At a minimum he will be maintaining close contact so long as we are in the test position to help with his problem with

16. As quickly as possible I would like to have sent to me the material which SADELLY very competently developed with QDCHAR. It is my plan then to attempt to expend and refine this together with QDCHAR, QDHAR, and De LORIE, after which it might be well to go over it with the personnel of the Havana Station to determine how these people might be best used and the best approach to reaching the targets that can be set up.
