Alloged Plans to Assassinate Fidel Castro Rus 30 September 1965

A Cuban emigre with emsellent contacts in the Movimiento Revolucionario del Pueble (MRP, Revolutionary Movement of the People). He has been an accurate reporter on this organisation and on general emigre political developments since about mid-1862.

Pield Comment: There have been a series of alloged plots to assessinate Fidel Castre Rum, planned by various emigres and emigre groups in Fight. This report provides additional information on the plot reported in CBDB-312/01984-65 dated 10 August 1985, from the same source. The people involved are Jose Prince, "Fito" Pelues, and Antonio Veciana Blanch, all Cuban emigres in Miami; an unnamed captain in the Cuban Bebel Army who had arrived in Miami from Cuba about mid-June; and one person in Cuba. Prince planned to solicit money in Caracas, Venezuela, to finance the operation. When he encountered difficulties in getting permission to re-enter the United States, he planned to send another person to Caracas to solicit money.

assaurante Fidel Castro Rus, said on 27 August 1965 that the plans were "coming along well," and that they had collected \$3,000 (U.S.) of the \$6,000 which is needed for the operation. However, on 8 September they said that their plans have been delayed for about a month and a half "for security reasons". They said that a communication was received from Cuba requesting the delay because "conditions were not right at the moment." It is not known when or how the members was received from Cuba. Also, the men said that the estimated cost of the mission has risen and they still need \$2,000. They appeared confident that they could raise the money, and that the mission would be a success, but were concerned with the effect that the delay might have on people who had contributed money and were expecting the assassination soon.

- S. Pelace whe interested in getting two poisons, potassium cyanide and ourses, from Caracar. Then Prince returned he brought a match box full of potassium cyanide which he had received from Armaldo Schwerert Ferrer, leader of the Movimiesto Revelucionarie del Puchlo (KEF, Revolutionary Movement of the Puople) in Caracas.
